the arrangements that will be available to the members as raffle prizes. This is the first presentation on orchids in a number of years and promises to be highly informative. We look forward to a great turnout!

March 22 is coming up right away! Our next bus trip is to The Brookwood Community. Brookwood is an educational and residential facility designed to enhance the lives of adults with intellectual disabilities. If you did not sign up at the February meeting, you will need to contact Bobbie Adams or Kathi Black to see if there are seats available. If so, you will need to get your reservation and payment by check to them right away. Dinner choices must be made in advance and include either Quiche & salad (\$10.95) or Mahi Mahi & Crab Supreme (\$16.95). Entrées are accompanied by a choice of salad or soup. Beverages other than water are \$1.95. Dessert choices are White Chocolate Bread Pudding or Key Lime Pie, each of which cost \$4.95. Your total lunch cost adding in gratuity and tax will be calculated at signup, and \$2 for the bus and \$.85 for the bus driver's meal will be added. A tour of Brookwood is included in the cost of your lunch. You will want to bring extra cash or your credit card for shopping at the fabulous gift shop and greenhouses. February Meeting - Tabletop Sampler - Featured SAFD Members

The February meeting of SAFD happened to fall on just one day after Valentine's Day. We were about to be left high and dry as far as a program presenter but several brave women stepped up to the plate and impressed us with "sample" Table Top demonstrations.

The evening began with **Be My Valentine** and was decorated by Betty Lind and Dianne Abrahams (with consultation and assembly help from Olga Lea.) The Valentine theme inspiration came from an 18" wire wreath to which wide bright red burlap fabric had been attached. The wreath made its original appearance in a Christmas



decoration. The base lit floral centerpiece was created using a layering technique. White hydrangeas anchored the arrangement with the next level consisting of red hypericum berries. Sprinkled amongst the berries were ginestra (fragrant tiny white flowers on a willowy stem). The centerpiece was crowned with a dozen bright red Freedom Roses. Also tucked into the arrangement were stems of wired hearts.

Peppermint camations, Freedom Roses and

variegated pittosporum adorned a ceramic pave' diamond ceramic heart shaped container and mint julep vases with arrangements. The chairs were sashed with bright red satin and a white satin table linen was topped with an brilliantly sparking embellished topper, courtesy of Elegant Beginnings. Silver beaded chargers, fine china, and red heart shaped salad plates which held various Valentine ornaments completed the table.

Donning her Easter bunny apron, Lois Maier presented **Hopping**

Into Spring as her tabletop theme. Sitting amongst a bed of parsley were perched charming bunnies, resting atop



Lois' Easter-themed heirloom dinner plates. Look closely at the adorable look of ruffled ribbon and lace on these plates. We were charmed by Lois' assortment of bunnies placed as



accents on the table. Her theme definitely brought back sentimental memories for all of us.

Hand-tied arrangements featuring a cabbage leaf collar and an array of pastel tulips, roses, heather and callilies were inserted into bunny-theme pitchers.



February Meeting Cont.

Dinner plates were the inspiration for the **Proud As A Peacock** tabletop which was presented by Phyllis Smith. Using jewel tones found in the eye of a peacock feather, Phyllis saturated her table with rich teal blue, deep royal blue and dazzling emerald green fabric and glassware accents. A teal satin table cover was topped with gold lamé that was sprinkled with beads in shades of teal. Elegant butterfly napkin rings were made from peacock feathers. The chairs were draped in teal and wrapped with a gold mesh fabric that held one white hydrangea and an iridescent mesh butterfly.



beautiful array of ceramic and glass containers ranging from a glazed ceramic Trojan horse to clear and opaque glass vases purchased at Ross or the dollar store. Using 6" wide burlap ribbon and bronze toned candle holders Pam's table created a mood of rustic elegance. Pam described how she embel-



lished her gold plastic chargers, by adding a layer of decouped tissue, painted with acrylics, and then gilded the painted sections to match her theme.

Flowers found in Pam's floral arrangements were white tulips, hydrangeas which were sprayed with florist spray to match the teal and blue colors of

in a tall glass vase filled with shades of blue glass beads was anchored by light blue hydrangeas, and a perfect placement of pale yellow roses, blue iris, purple statice and various grasses added delicacy.

Pam Bates wowed everyone with her **Modern Naturals** tabletop with a generous collection of table arrangements. Using elegant table linens and napkins she whipped up in her "spare time", Pam's talents were truly highlighted. In addition to entertaining our eyes with her creativity, she mixed varieties of dried naturals, artificial flowers and fresh flowers in a



the tablecloth, Akita roses, amaranthus, lilies, camations, sisal, and an assortment of dried botanicals purchased at Hobby Lobby. Most arrangements were adorned with tassels purchased at Tuesday Morning. Pam encouraged us to look for supplies from the dollar store, discount stores, up through wholesalers.

February's meeting was an evening filled with variety, interest, beauty and creativity. It was an evening meant to inspire you to step out of your comfort zone and create your own tabletop design for the 2011 SAFD Tabletop Extravaganza which is right around the corner on Thursday, April 14th. March Birth Flower

Flowers popping up is a sure sign of Spring, and this month's birth flower is the cheery daffodil and is one of the first flowers to bloom in spring. Daffodils are members of the genus *Narcissus*. They grow from bulbs and are considered perennials. The Spanish name for the flower is jonquil. Their most common color is yellow, but can also range from orange, pink, white or variations of these colors. Daffodils originated in the Mediterranean, but they now grow all over the world. In the language of flowers, daffodils symbolize friendship, chivalry, respect, modesty and faithfulness. Because it is one of the first flowers to bloom in spring, it is also symbolic of hope.

For Houston gardeners, you do not need to chill your bulbs before planting. Just keep them in a cool, dry place until planting time, which is November or December.

I will qualify this with “be sure to check with your CPA” if you have any questions. These could be subject to interpretation by your CPA and will depend on your filing status as to whether they qualify to be deducted.
